

You must have a responsible adult accompany you and take you home on the day of your procedure.

A F E W K E Y N O T E S

- If authorization is required, we will do our very best to expedite the process. If we receive a denial or no response, we may need to cancel.
- We will not be able to provide you an exact time for your procedure until 24-48 hours prior to your procedure date. **If you do not hear from our office 24 hours prior to, you may give us a call.**
- If you've had a change in your health, it is best to give us a call to make sure it will not effect your procedure being done. For example, starting new medications including antibiotics or a GLP-1. **Please Inform us If you have a pacemaker, defibrillator or have become pregnant.**
- Conscious sedation will be provided and is used to help patients relax and feel comfortable during a procedure, while still remaining awake and able to respond to commands. The goal is to reduce anxiety, pain, and discomfort, without putting the patient fully to sleep. **If you are taking Ozempic, Wegovy or Mounjaro please note that only moderate sedation will be provided.**



HOW TO PREPARE FOR YOUR PROCEDURE



It is recommended to stop taking the below medications prior to your procedure.

Do NOT stop any medication before speaking with your prescribing physician.

Enoxaparin (Lovenox) 24 hours	Warfarin (Coumadin) 5 days
Abciximab (Reopro) 48 hours	Dabigatran (Pradaxa) 7 days
Dipyridamole (Aggrenox) 48 hours	Clopidogrel (Plavix) 7 days
Cilostazol (Pletal) 48 hours	Prasugrel (Effient) 7 days
Apixaban (Eliquis) 3 days	Ticagrelor (Brilinta) 7 days
Rivaroxaban (Xarelto) 3 days	Ticlopidine (Ticlid) 14 days
Fondaparinux (Arixtra) 3 days	Aspirin (any dose) 6 days

If you are taking an anticoagulant, blood thinner, antiplatelet agent, chemotherapy not listed above, please call the office at 702-960-4150 Ext 106 to discuss.

Speak with your Diabetes doctor about how to take your diabetes medication the day of the procedure since you may not be able to eat for up to 8 hours prior to the starting time of the procedure.



**NO FOOD
NO DRINKS**

This includes coffee, tea, chewing gum, candies, etc

8hours
PRIOR TO PROCEDURE
8oz of clear water allowed

ON THE DAY OF YOUR PROCEDURE

Take your usual heart and blood pressure medications when you would usually take them, with a small sip of water.

2 hours prior to procedure, STOP all water intake

You must have your responsible adult with you for the staff to identify prior to your procedure

You will be asked to refrain from driving for up to 24 hours after your procedure due to residual effects from sedation. It is illegal to operate a vehicle under the influence.

Please resume taking your medication 24 hours after your procedure
